Military Child Coalition Checklist for School Moves

From the Parent/Guardian:

- Student's birth certificate
- Student's social security number
- Student's health record (immunization record, etc.)
- Legal documents as needed
- Proof of residency/military orders

School Liaison

The School Liaison (SL) is the primary point of contact between the military installation, local school administration, including the Department of Defense Education Agency (DoDEA) schools, parents and the community.

Why is a School Liaison important?

There are currently **2,000,000** military-connected children in the United States.

Over **80** percent of these children, **1,105,267** students attend Pre-K through 12th grade in public schools.

EVERY school district in the United States has military-connected students.

Military families move an average of every two to three years. Which means, approximately **500,000** military children change schools **every year**.

According to Department of Defense (DoD), most military children will attend **six to nine** different school systems in their lives from kindergarten to 12th grade.
